Introduction to Christian Doctrine (level 4)

Mondays and Wednesday evenings 7-9pm
Friday teaching days 15, 29 Jan; 12 Feb & 5 March

This module examines central Christian theological affirmations about the person and work of Jesus Christ (Christology and soteriology) and considers what follows for Christian life and practice. It introduces you to theological debates about the person and work of Jesus Christ down the centuries and explores some of the implications of these for Christian life and practice.

Introduction to Church History (level 4)

Mondays and Wednesday evenings 7-9pm
Friday teaching days 8, 22 Jan; 5 & 26 Feb

This module provides a broad overview of church history focusing on the historical development of the doctrine of the Trinity. Key stages in the development of Trinitarian thinking are related to the church's social, cultural and political context and to the historical roots of specific denominational identities.

New Testament Studies (level 5)

Mondays and Wednesday evenings 7-9pm
Friday teaching days 8, 22 Jan; 5 & 26 Feb

This module explores the mission and ministry of Jesus in the Gospels and the early Christians' experience of the risen Christ and the Holy Spirit with particular reference to Luke-Acts and Pauline epistles – including Romans. It examines how Jesus draws on the theology of contemporary Judaism reshapes it into the theology of the

Christian community. The experiences and concerns of the earliest Christian communities are explored and applied to how these shape the ministry and mission of the church today.

This module will explore specific biblical texts and themes from a range of hermeneutical perspectives and bring these to bear on contemporary contexts. The responsible use of the Bible in Christian theology, preaching and praxis.

The Bible and Christian Faith (level 7)

Friday teaching days 15, 29 Jan & 12 Feb

This module will explore specific biblical texts and themes from a range of hermeneutical perspectives and bring these to bear on contemporary contexts.

Advanced Study of a Christian Figure (level 7)

Friday teaching days 15, 29 Jan; 12 Feb & 5 March

The module will not only offer in-depth exploration of various approaches to spiritual direction, informed by classic Christian and alternative models of spirituality, but also enable development of - and reflection on - either initial or ongoing practice in spiritual direction.

Levels of Study

Study in Higher Education takes place at various levels. The Common Awards cover levels 4 to 7, as follows:

Level 4 – first year of a full-time degree / CertHE (120 credits)

Level 5 – second year of a full-time degree / DipHE (120 credits)

Level 6 – third year of a full-time degree / BA or GDip (120 credits)

Level 7 – postgraduate study / PGDip (120 credits) or MA (180 credits)
