4ICH Introduction to Church History (level 4)

This module provides a broad overview of church history focusing on the historical development of the doctrine of the Trinity. Key stages in the development of Trinitarian thinking are related to the church's social, cultural and political context and to the historical roots of specific denominational identities.

4BICD/4ICD (Brief) Introduction to Christian Doctrine (level4)

This module examines central Christian theological affirmations about the person and work of Jesus Christ (Christology and soteriology) and considers what follows for Christian life and practice. It introduces students to theological debates about the person and work of Jesus Christ down the centuries and explores some of the implications of these for Christian life and practice.

5ME Mission & Evangelism (level 5)

The aim of ministry is not to assemble around us a group of like-minded people, but to offer the world the news of God's unconditional love. In this module we explore how modern methods of mission seek to do that. We shall examine contemporary, contextual and pioneer approaches to Christian mission in theory and in practice, aiming better to understand our own call to mission, and how to live that call in our own future ministry.

5BS Biblical Studies (level 5)

Focused study of specific books and passages from Old and New Testaments; orientation to the genres of material being discussed (e.g. prophecy, narrative, gospel, paraenesis); different critical approaches to the Old and New Testaments; the responsible use of the Bible in Christian theology, preaching and praxis.

The texts studied in this module must be different from those studied in other Biblical Studies modules.

Levels of Study
