What is St Augustine's College of Theology?

St Augustine's is the Church of England's longest-standing non-residential theological college. Since our beginnings in 1959, we have grown to become the South East's provider of choice for contextually-based, non-residential education, preparation and formation of licensed lay and ordained ministers. Alongside those studying for ordination and lay qualifications we have a thriving community of students studying theology for the sheer joy of following high quality teaching programmes in Christian faith and practice.

Our adventurous community of learning celebrates a diversity of Christian tradition and expression. We welcome anyone seeking an accessible, yet challenging, education in theology. Our students come from varied backgrounds, including other denominations as well as all branches of the Church of England.

We are dispersed across the South East, embedded within our sponsoring dioceses and enriched by the Benedictine environment of our centre at Malling Abbey.

What are the MA Taster Module Options?

At St Augustine's we believe we should make theological learning as accessible as possible. If you are interested in pursuing theological studies at postgraduate level, but joining a full MA programme feels like a big step, the taster module gives you an opportunity to test your appetite and aptitude for academic study without committing to a full programme at this point.

Our taster module allows you, over one term, to take a single 20-credit module from our MA programme in Theology, Ministry and Mission. The main MA taster module available in the Spring Term 2022 (mid-March to early June) is **Advanced Study of a Christian Figure**.

This module focuses on one major figure from the Christian tradition and this term the focus will be on **St John of the Cross**. The module will include detailed attention to the historical context within which St John of the Cross lived and its importance for his life and work; critical analysis of selected theological themes from St John's work within the context of his life; exploration of the nature of and reasons for the enduring significance of his contribution to the Christian tradition; and examination of the ways in which his work informs the life and mission of the Church today. Other MA courses are available, too, as taster modules:

- Advanced Topic in Christian Doctrine (focus on problem of evil)
- Advanced Old Testament Studies

What are the entry requirements for the MA Taster Module?

Note that for the Christian Doctrine and Old Testament modules listed above, a good grounding in Christian Doctrine and Biblical Studies (resp.) at undergraduate level is required.

Where and when?

The 2022 teaching sessions for 'Advanced Study of a Christian Figure' (St John of the Cross) will be delivered on four Fridays and one Wednesday, at our **Malling Abbey** teaching centre:

- Friday 25th March
- Friday 22nd April
- Friday 6th May
- Friday 20th May
- *Wednesday* 1st June (alteration due to Bank Holiday 3rd June)

The timings are **10.30am – 4pm**. This includes breaks throughout the day, as well as College worship at the start

How much study time is involved?

You should expect to devote at least 10 hours of independent study per week.

Library resources

We have two libraries: one at Trinity House, Southwark and one at our West Malling centre. Note borrowing books will need to be done in person. If you aren't intending to use our libraries it is vital you find other sources to get the books you need.

How is the module assessed?

In order to complete the module you will be expected to submit a written assignment of 6,000 words. The deadline for submitting the assignment is **1pm, Tuesday 14th June 2022**.

Will completing the MA Taster Module give me an academic qualification?

Completing the taster module alone doesn't give you an academic qualification. However, it is a module which normally forms part of our MA programme. If you pass the assignments for the module and decide to continue your studies, you will be able to enrol on the MA in Theology, Ministry and Mission, and the module you have completed will count towards the MA, accredited by Durham University.

What happens after I finish the module?

It's up to you! You can choose to stop there, or, subject to passing the taster module assignments, you can enrol into our MA programme, as described above. If you enrol, your completed Taster module will count towards that programme.

What does the MA programme then involve?

Normally, the academic year involves three taught modules in Year 1 and Year 2, with an MA Dissertation in Year 3. (You also have the option to study full-time.) For more information about the MA programme, see: <https://staugustinescollege.ac.uk/courses/postgraduate-studies/>
