Tim began his ordained ministry in 1998 in the Diocese of Salisbury, first in the Benefice of Blandford Forum and Langton Long, then in the Benefice of Bourne Valley. Tim spent 14 years as an incumbent in the Diocese of Chelmsford from 2006 when he became Priest in Charge of a

group of rural parishes near Stansted Airport which became known as the Pilgrim Parishes. He is currently House for Duty assistant curate in 10 villages: the Easters, Rodings and Canfield. Tim has been profoundly influenced over the last 30 years by the New Wine movement - appreciating particularly their focus on a threefold ordained ministry for men and women, renewing the local church and resourcing smaller rural congregations for mission and ministry.
